TWO YEARS IN REVIEW (2015-1026)

2015 and 2016 were years of "new and change" beginning with the revision of the By -Laws by the Board of Directors' appointed committee of Fran Holden, Carol Haynes, and Barbara Bogart, and approved by the general membership September 21, 2015. The Policies and Procedures Manual that formalizies the operational aspects of NNMQG and the Board of Directors was approved November, 2016. This Manual provides the Board with formality that can be ammended based on the operational needs of NNMQG and the Board.

Our Community Service activies have included placemats and napkins for Kitchen Angels, baby quilts, etc., and as reported by Donna Ormerod, over 700 items have been provided to various agencies. The highlight was the completion of 96 twin sized quilts for the students at the School for the Deaf in September 2016.

Quilts of Valor is an on-going project to cover New Mexico veterans and service men and women that have been deployed. Seventeen quilts were provided to a New Mexico National Guard unit deployed in 2015 and 7 quilts for New Mexico veterans. As we continued making QOVs, we were made aware of a New Mexico National Guard unit that would be returning in November, 2016. We provided 125 Quilts of Valor to that National Guard unit in December 2016. In addition, we presented 8 QOVs to New Mexico veterans from service in Afghanistan, VietNam, Korea, and WWII during Quilt Fiesta, and an additional 12 QOVs to other New Mexico veterans for a total of 145 QOVs in 2016.

Our programs included Betty Busby, Nancy Eha, Rod Daniel & Jim Carnevale, Michelle Watts, Sabrina Zarco, Pam Holland, Karla Alexander, Judith Roderick, as well as guild members providing topics of interest like "My Go To Quilt" and "Entering a Quilt in a Quilt Show". We also had our social and fund-raising events with the Little Red Hen and our Christmas Teas. Our Speakers of the Guild in 2015 were Kay Eccleston, Mary Jo Stipe, and Judy Verzino. In 2016, our Speakers of the Guild were Carla Beene and Sue Clarkson.

The 2016 Donation Quilt, "High Road to Taos", was chaired by Carla Beene leading a great team of piecers and quilters.

Quilt Fiesta 2016 was held at the Santa Fe Convention Center, chaired by Lynne Horpedahl. What a GRAND event. It was a two-year challenge of stepping out of our box and moving to a new event center. Thank you to Lynne and all the Quilt Fiesta Chairs: Vendors—Nancy Mroz & Terry Lopez; Publicity—Mary Jo Stipe; Sponsorships & Ads—Fran Holden; Gift Shop—Liz Rickert & Sharon Cook; Design and Hanging—Nancy Stiedle & Julee Coffman; Quilt Receiving and Pick-up—Jean Callaghan; Judging Room Coordinator-Linda Robinson; and the many, many volunteers that it takes to manage Quilt Fiesta. *Deb Martinez* was the President of NNMQG when I became a member of the guild. Deb is a native Santa Fean, retired from the City of Albuquerque 16 years ago, married with 4 children, 16 1/2 grandchildren; a truly devoted daughter, wife, mother, and grandmother. When Deb retired, she became a quilter which took on a life of it's own. Deb says, "Life has been so much fun since! I began as more of an art quilter, then went to more conventional styles of bed quilts, and feel myself moving back to the artsy side of myself again." Welcome Deb back as President of NNMQG; we look forward to an exciting 2017 under your leadership.

Julee Coffman is a native New Mexican, born in Tucumcari, raised on a cattle ranch, and has lived in Santa Fe since 1980. Julee raised two "smart and loving sons", is a devoted daughter, going back to the cattle ranch during branding season to help out, a loving mother, and a loyal friend. Julee has been quilting for 13 years, and as she states, "in love with fabric since sewing with her Grandmother as a child. " Julee owned La Servilleta, a table linen business in the 1980's, selling to small businesses throughout the state. Julee says, "I began quilting when I visited SFQ with a friend and won a doorprize!" Julee has designed several original quilt patterns, her first being an Indoor Hopscotch Mat for children. Julee's designs are available at Santa Fe Quilting. We welcome Julee as our Vice President and look forward to her insights and leadership.

Ronda Lech became a member of NNMQG in 2015, moved away and moved back to become a member again in 2016. Ronda states, "My first real craft endeavor was while living in Florida during the 1980's. 2017 "Finish It Challenge" Registration

WHAT: This group activity is open to all guild members. The purpose of this challenge is for members to complete five unfinished quilt projects during 2017.

WHEN: Starting in January 2017, this group will meet every other month ending in November 2017.

WHERE: Meetings will be at the regular guild meeting 30 minutes prior to the start of the meeting.

JOIN: Complete and turn in the registration form with initial entry fee of 3 Fat Quarters of high quality 100% cotton quilting fabric at the January meeting.

RULES OF THE CHALLENGE:

1. Attend each of the 6 meetings or make arrangements for someone to show your project if you cannot attend. Meetings will be held the months of January, March, May, July, September, and November.

2. At the January meeting, turn in the registration form and 3 Fat Quarters. The registration form will list and describe 5 unfinished projects that you desire to complete during the year. A PROJECT IS COMPLETE WHEN IT IS QUILTED AND BOUND.

3. At the March, May, July, September and November meetings, bring 1 of your finished projects listed on your registration form.

4. If you are unable to finish a project, bring 3 Fat Quarters of high quality 100% cotton quilting fabric, which is the "fee" for not completing your project. The Fat Quarters will be kept until the end of the challenge. You can catch-up and complete all the projects by the November meeting.

5. At the November meeting, the Fat Quarters held will be divided among the members who successfully finish the 5 projects listed on their project listing.

You can be a WINNER for having completed 5 projects and by receiving Fat Quarters. Please contribute fabric that you would want to receive.
