We have so much to offer our members this year, and I hope you will participate in as many things as you can. Because we don't have a quilt show this year, what a wonderful time to start planning and working on your show quilt for 2018. It's also a great year to focus on Community Service and Quilts of Valor as well as to take some classes from nationally and internationally known teachers to build new skills or hone old skills. Whatever you choose to participate, it is my privilege to share your quilting journey for the coming year.

Community Service and Quilts of Valor are so important to our Guild, and I would like to challenge each of you to participate in our endeavors by completing:

- I quilt for community service

 (any size, but twin/lap are particularly helpful),
- I quilt for Quilts of Valor (60" x 80" and patriotic theme)
- 2 placemats
- 2 pillowcases

If each of us can do this in 2017, our burden to fill requests in 2018 (when we focus on Quilt Fiesta) will be lessened.

As a fun challenge, I would also like to challenge each member to complete a small quilt—no larger than I4" x I4"—for the county fair display in August. Quilts are to contain only three colorways (white and/or black each count as one color way), but can include all the values in that color way. For example, if green is one of your colorways, you can go light to dark green, but beware of when the greens cross too far into the yellows or blues and become a different colorway. This is a challenge that allows you to do whatever you like: art quilting, applique, traditional piecing, or combinations of techniques.

I hope to see all of you at our Community Service Day on Saturday, February 25 at the NEA Building. It's a great time to get to know fellow quilters and do good for the community!

GLEE HUGHEY WENZEL

Glee Hughey Wenzel, born in Orlando, FL, on August 14, 1939, passed away in Santa Fe on January 21, 2017, after a life well and richly lived. She is survived by her husband of 43 years, Robert Wenzel, and her sisters, Carol Fulwyler and Virginia Evans. Glee held a Bachelor of Arts in History from Ohio Wesleyan University, a Master of Arts in Teaching from Wesleyan University, and a Master of Library Science from the University of Washington. She taught ancient history in Connecticut, served as a children's librarian in NYC, a reference librarian in Los Alamos, and as Director of the Santa Fe Public Library from 1974-1980, during which time she administered the building of the La Farge Branch. After retirement, Glee was a generous volunteer for a number of community services. She was an award-winning quilter and was active in the Northern New Mexico Quilt Guild, where she had many friends. Besides traveling to Europe and Canada, Glee and her husband had wonderful adventures in Australia, Africa, South America and Antarctica. She was never happier than when she was getting on a plane going to a new place. Our memories of good times with Glee ease the pain of our loss. We will keep these memories forever.

COMMUNITY SERVICE DAY QUILT DIRECTIONS

February 25, 2017 8:30am-3:30pm NEA Building

Project is Scrappy Random Railfence Block Quilt

with permission from Riel Nason

- This pattern will use numerous 2 ½ wide strips of fabric. You can use yardage cut WOF or you can use your many leftover scraps from various projects that are 2 ½ wide by 4 to 10 inches long. You will need a total length of at least 45 WOF strips to make 20 blocks. The more pieces of different fabrics you have the more interesting your quilt will be.
- 2) Take your 2 ½ inch strips and cut them into random lengths between 4 and 10 inches long.
- 3) Start randomly grabbing any two pieces and sew them together. Chain stitching will help this go faster. Don't think about what pieces you are using, just grab different lengths & colors and sew!
- 4) After you have joined some in groups of two, then join those groups. Just keep joining until you have a very long piece---the longer it is the more variety.
- 5) Press the seams of your long strip. Direction of pressing does not matter.
- 6) Cut 12 ½ strips from your long piece. If you come to a place where the cut will land on a seam or close to it, just cut that piece off and continue cutting.
- 7) Choose 6 strips from your pile and sew them together using a 1/4 inch seam. Again...RANDOM is the key to a fun quilt.
- 8) Press and trim to a 12 ½ by 12 ½ block.
- 9) Arrange blocks in a railfence pattern. Sew blocks together using ¹/₄ inch seam. I sewed 5 rows with 4 blocks in each row. Press each row in the opposite direction. Sew rows together.
- 10) Adding a border or two makes this a perfect lap size quilt for community service. I used I and 3 inch finished borders.
