I am anxious to see all (80!) of of her quilts done in the Indigo Shibori Dyeing method and even more excited to learn how to work with silk. Silk is so beautiful, but so hard to work with. I'm hearing (and believing) that it's not that difficult if you know how to do it properly. There are **still a few spaces in the class**, so you haven't missed your chance to get in on the action.

At our March meeting we will be selling **raffle tickets** for our next mini-quilt raffle. Although the drawing isn't until April at the retreat, tickets will be available in March for those not going to the retreat. **Lea Armstrong** is making the wall hanging this time around. I've seen it as a work in progress, and you will not want to miss out on a chance to win this beautiful piece. You may remember Lea's incredible winning quilts at the Quilt Fiesta last October—think Sashiko!

Because we don't have Quilt Fiesta this year, the **County Fair (August 2-5)** serves as a fun opportunity to **show quilts** you've made this year. If you've never shown a quilt before, this is a great place to start. Judging is done very differently than it is at a quilt show, so you don't have to worry quite so much about everything being perfect.

Our **Guild is active** at the County Fair in several ways. First, we **hang** the quilts and take them down. Second, we make and **sell tickets** for a queen-size quilt (our big fund raiser in non-Fiesta years). Third, we **publicize** the Guild and attract new members. Just for the sake of fun, I have added a challenge element to our County Fair display this year. I am challenging each of you to **make** a 14" x 14" wall hanging (smaller is OK) that includes only 3 colors. You can use all the values in the color (lights to darks), but you must use three colors. Quilts can be traditional piecing, applique, paper-pieced, or an art quilt. All techniques are permitted as long as the size is not exceeded. We'll have attendees vote on their favorite, and there will be a prize for the popular vote winner. If you are after the bragging rights that Ist place gives, keep in mind that the voters come in all ages so don't be afraid to appeal to the younger 4-H kids that are there.

I hope you all have a **fun** month quilting.

March 28 8:30am-3:30pm • **Road to Success with Silk**/Debbie Maddy Learn how to successfully use silk in your quilts, from what size needle to how to stop raveling. Conquer your fear of working with silk while you create a tablerunner. Four openings still available! Held at NEA Bldg.

- Workship fee: \$40 (fee can be paid at Guild meeting)
- Optional Class Kit: \$59. Contact Terry Lopez if you'd like a pre-made kit. Purchase kit at the workshop.
- OR Purchase silk fat quarters for only \$4.35 each in striking colors at Santa Fe Quilting if you'd like to make your own kit.
- •SUPPLIES LIST: Table Art Pattern Optional ribbon (1 5/8 yard used on sample) or other embellishments 1 ¼ yards fabric for backing (does not have to be silk) ½ yard silk for binding Thread ~ cotton or silk (I use cotton) Needles for machine ~ size 70/10 or 75/11 Fine pins ~ the package will say fine, silk, .05 (available in class-for purchase) Press cloth—cotton is fine and silk organza ones will be available for purchase in class. Sewing machine in good working order Extension cord Rotary cutting supplies mat (large enough for a fat quarter to fit on) 2 rulers (one ruler that is at least 18" long) cutter Bring any extra feet that you have for your machine, especially zipper or edge stitching / edge joining feet.

If you do not purchase a kit for this class, you will need: Pattern • 5 fat quarters of silk for the runner • Ultra light fusible interfacing: 2 yds if 60" wide or 4 yds if 20" wide.

QUILT SIZES

A general guideline on quilt sizes most used by community service organizations: Crib size quilts: 36 to 45 inches wide by 45 to 54 inches long. Lap size quilts: 54 to 60 inches wide by 68 to 76 inches long.

Please note ALL sizes of quilts are appreciated and useable!

PLACEMATS ARE NEEDED! POTHOLDERS TOO!

We have requests for placemats from not one, but *two* organizations! In determining size, a standard size placemat is 14" long by 18" wide. However, this size is not absolute, so adapt as needed for your pattern—an inch smaller or bigger than the suggested measurement is fine.

Fabric considerations to keep in mind as you make a placemat... Kitchen Angels has requested that since their clients are of many different faiths, they would prefer <u>not</u> to have holiday-themed placemats. In addition, since they have very few young children, please no child-themed fabrics.
